

A LIFE FREE FROM PAIN

Matt Erman

Matt is thankful to resume his active lifestyle as he enjoys the outdoors, hunting and fishing.

Matt Erman began having sharp pain in his left leg that wouldn't go away in August 2013. "I was in constant pain, and it affected everything I did. I didn't sleep much at night because the pain would wake me up every couple of hours," Matt recalled.

The young man in his 30s went to a chiropractor for several months, hoping the pain would lessen, but it didn't. Pain medications and anti-inflammatory drugs didn't work. Matt didn't know what the problem was – but he knew he needed relief from the constant pain.

Matt's chiropractor referred him to Robert Thompson, M.D., a neurologist. He performed an electromyography (EMG) that showed Matt's pain was due to a spinal problem. Dr. Thompson referred Matt to the Genesis Back Pain Treatment Center to have a team of specialists further evaluate his situation.

Matt explained where and when the pain occurred to the physicians and staff who are specially trained to evaluate back pain. A Magnetic Resonance Imaging (MRI) showed Matt's problem was a ruptured disc on his lower back pushing on the spinal nerve root, causing a pinched nerve and the leg pain.

Coordinated Care

Due to the care coordinated by the staff in the Back Pain Treatment Center, Matt was promptly evaluated by neurosurgeons and other experts to identify the source of his pain. "I was relieved to find out what the problem was," he said.

Within 10 days Matt had a procedure done by Albert Camma, M.D., neurosurgeon, to remove a portion of the disc that was pushing on the nerve root. "I was expecting to have to wait six to eight weeks to get the surgery, but it was less than two weeks. I was impressed I got in quickly."


The Sooner the Better

Correctly identifying and treating back problems early is important not only to lessen pain but also prevent further complications. "Matt had muscle weakness, and since fast treatment is important when patients have this symptom, we did an accelerated review to get him scheduled for the procedure as soon as possible," said Dr. Camma. "The sooner you can get treatment, the more likely there is to be success. We have specialists trained to evaluate patients and help get them treatment as soon as possible."

Matt is grateful to receive the expert care close to home and be pain-free. He was walking a few hours after the back surgery and went home the same day. He had physical therapy close to his home near Coshocton, and Dr. Camma coordinated care with the rehabilitation therapists. Less than two months after the surgery, Matt was back to work in an oil field/pipeline construction business.

Pain-free & Active

PHENOMENAL CANCER CARE RIGHT HERE

Jane Hodges had a stabbing pain in her back that wouldn't go away, so she made an appointment with her family doctor, Jack Butterfield, M.D. In less than two weeks, she had gone through testing and had a diagnosis.

"I was shocked to learn I had Stage 4 lung cancer," Jane said. She didn't have any family risk factors for lung cancer and had only smoked a little bit in her 20s. She had been through cancer before when she was diagnosed with breast cancer in 1987, so she knew how important it was to get the best care. Now she had a decision to make – where should she go for treatment?

To help her decide, she met with Shyamal Bastola, M.D., hematology/oncology at the Genesis Cancer Care Center to discuss her options. Jane also decided to get a couple of second opinions, and Genesis Cancer Services staff set the appointments for her at two hospitals in larger cities. She discovered the plan of care Dr. Bastola recommended was the same as the other two hospitals suggested – right down to the specific treatments.

No Better Care Than Here

Jane decided to have her care at Genesis, and she's glad she did. "You're not going to get better care than here – it has been phenomenal," she said. "Whenever I had a question, the staff would have an answer for me before I left the doctor's office. If I left a voice mail or an email – they always got back to me the same day – even if it wasn't urgent. They were always right on top of everything. You couldn't ask for better quality."

DESIGNING THE PATIENT EXPERIENCE

When it came time to design the new Dr. Nick A. & Nancy R. Sarap Cancer Center, we wanted to make sure patients would have the best possible experience. "We sat down with patients, doctors and nurses and designed the ideal patient experience before we even met with the architects," said Scott Wegner, M.D., medical director of Genesis Cancer Services. "The cancer center started with a plan for patient care and became a building – rather than the other way around."

One of the unique features of the new center is the chemotherapy pods, which are similar to first-class seating on an airline. The pods are designed to make the visit more calming – like views of the fitness trail, large windows and private treatment areas. Patient Jane Hodges had an opportunity to try out the new pods during her treatment, and she appreciated the privacy of them. Like other patients, she provided her feedback to help finalize the design.

"We've worked hand-in-hand with patients to design the best possible experience for people in our community dealing with cancer," Dr. Wegner said. "The Sarap Cancer Center is a realization of a long-term vision completely focused on patient-centered care."

COUNSELING HELPS WITH PAIN

Sondra Young was an ambitious career woman when she was diagnosed with multiple sclerosis (MS) in 2004. She had to quit working and ended up in a wheelchair. She was hospitalized because the MS symptoms caused pain so intense she had problems getting out of bed and couldn't dress herself.

The young woman began outpatient physical therapy at Genesis to improve her balance and strength. Her physical therapist suggested psychological counseling to help improve Sondra's outlook and perhaps lessen her pain.

Positive Results

Sondra met with Brenda Verhey, LPCC, a counselor at Genesis Rehabilitation Services, who helps patients and families learn how to cope with the emotional consequences resulting from constant pain. “The counseling helped give her an outlet to have someone to talk to – to work on things that create stress – which can make MS symptoms worse because the muscles tighten and increase pain,” Verhey said. Verhey meets with Sondra before her physical therapy at the Genesis Center for Occupational & Outpatient Rehabilitation.

Incorporating counseling with treatments for MS and physical therapy helped Sondra feel better. “When I first started, the pain was off the charts – above a 10 on a scale of 1 to 10. Now, it's a 2 or 3,” she said.

A New Outlook

Today Sondra has a new outlook on life. “Counseling saved me,” she said. “It helped me realize I can do this. I have to fight and keep moving forward.”

Counseling also gave her the confidence to return to work and attend college. She has been working for a year helping others with disabilities, and she's taking college classes to pursue a degree in social work.

“If I hadn't had counseling, my depression would probably have worsened, and I would have had more pain,” Sondra said.

A couple of years after being diagnosed with MS, Sondra couldn't lift her leg an inch off the floor. Now she can walk about 280 feet with forearm crutches. And she's back to enjoying life – going to restaurants and movies, and visiting family and friends.

“The counselor helped me tremendously,” Sondra said. “From where I was before – not being able to get out of bed – to where I am now is a huge difference. It's been amazing.”

COMBINING COUNSELING WITH PAIN MANAGEMENT

If you've ever been in constant pain, you understand the psychological toll it can have on you and your family. Genesis began offering psychological counseling along with pain management for many different types of pain including back and neurological. “There's a high incidence of depression among people suffering from chronic pain,” said Yahya Bakdali, M.D., pain management/physiatry. “Psychological counseling plays an important role in pain management, and it's part of the comprehensive care in treating patients with a history of chronic pain.”

Many people with constant pain suffer from depression, anxiety, frustration and anger, which can impact day-to-day activities, relationships and the ability to work. The emotional responses can increase physical pain. Managing the stress and emotions associated with pain becomes an important part of healing.

Genesis is the only hospital in the area offering on-site counseling. Brenda Verhey, LPCC, a licensed social worker and licensed professional clinical counselor, meets with patients and families.

“There can be stress, pain and coping issues when you're managing pain,” Verhey said. “When the psychological therapy is combined with pain management, we're finding patients have less pain and more self-confidence, and get better faster.”

Verhey helps patients and families understand the body's response to stress caused by pain, and how to develop coping strategies to manage stress and decrease depression, anxiety and anger. She focuses on helping patients enjoy a better quality of life, find new ways to enjoy old activities, and for many, to actually reduce their physical pain.

Topping Out!


An exciting milestone was celebrated in a topping out ceremony on Wednesday, March 5. Genesis, Turner Construction Company representatives and construction workers were on hand for the event. During the ceremony, the final steel beams were lifted into the hospital's new addition. A small evergreen tree, symbolizing growth and good luck, was atop the three beams, which were signed by employees, physicians, volunteers, board members and donors.



Sarap Cancer Center Progresses

The Dr. Nick A. & Nancy R. Sarap Cancer Center is getting closer to completion. The exterior panels and roof have been installed. The interior of the building is now the main focus of construction. As we planned the interior space, we wanted to meet the needs of patients and those who care for them.

To do this, we set up two chemotherapy pods (where patients receive chemotherapy and other treatments) in the current Genesis Hematology & Cancer Care Center. Patients received their treatments in the pods, and their feedback, along with input from physicians, nurses and other staff, helped to finalize the design. The center is expected to open in late fall.

New Addition Shapes Up

After the new addition topped out, the roof and exterior panels were installed. The crane that has been a part of the skyline over Bethesda Hospital was removed, marking another milestone as the phase of construction that included heavy lifting of materials came to a close. Windows were put in place, and now crews are focusing mainly on the interior space of the new addition.



Behavioral Health Update

Genesis Behavioral Health, located behind Bethesda Hospital, will open later this summer. The site of the former Forest View Health Campus, the building is being renovated. Members of our community no longer need to travel around Zanesville for behavioral health care offered by Genesis; everything will be found in one, convenient location that is secure and private.

Behavioral Health includes the following among other services:

- Inpatient adult, child and adolescent psychiatric care
- Partial hospitalization program
- Outpatient adult, child and adolescent psychiatric care
- Help for substance abuse and addictions such as alcohol and drugs

Construction Begins on Medical Office Building

Construction began early this year on the medical office building on the west side of the Physicians Pavilion. It will connect to the pavilion and the hospital to make it easy to move between the buildings. The first floor will include outpatient neuroscience and orthopedic services, as well as physician offices. The second floor will be physicians and outpatient services for heart and vascular care. The new medical office building will open in 2015.

Parking and More

If you've driven around Bethesda lately, you've certainly noticed detours and road closures. All of this is happening to create a beautiful campus with ample parking for patients and visitors. The Gorsuch Fitness Trail was closed for a few months to ensure everyone's safety, and it's expected to reopen in early July. A small portion of the trail will close again this fall, but walkers and joggers will still be able to enjoy the trail with a minor route change.

Back to Basics – Back Pain Program

These classes offer ways to help you control your lower back pain.
